Replacement cost of the chair is \$65.00. I am glad to say that several of our members have offered to replace it.


Thank you both Dan Rager and Dianna Wood for offering to replace this chair, knowing that neither of you were responsible for it.

This PowerPoint presentation includes over 100 pictures and maps.


This presentation will be in the 130 year

GHOST HUNT - ARE THERE SPIRITS?

Are there spirits hovering in our Painesville Railroad Depot? And if so where do they come from? Do they intend us good or harm? Questions like these flooded one's senses on Saturday, May 13, 2023 as a group of ghost hunting enthusiasts gathered at the museum to seek answers. To our surprise many of the participants brought with them their own ghost hunting equipment. At 9:00 PM sharp, under the direction of Cathi Weber and Theresa Argie of the Haunted Housewives of Willoughby, the paranormal hunt began.

As participants in this event, we did not really know what to expect. We had heard stories of strange things happening in past. Breaking down into several groups, our leader, Theresa used a recording device and asked specific questions of the "spirits" at the depot. When a question was asked it was followed by a long, silent pause before starting the next question. Inquires were made of the spirits' names and whether or not we were even welcomed there. When the recordings were played back, the silence was broken by definite staticky, angry sounding and sometimes screaming responses. Although we were not able to make out the

Our intrepid group of ghost hunters was able to take a full tour of the depot, even to its most remote recesses in the cellar. Experimental contact stations were also set up around the engine barn, the 999 Engine and at the caboose. A blazing fire was lit to both break the darkness of the night and to warm one's weary soul. Refreshments were provided to help fortify the ghost hunters shaken nerves.


