

Mike's career as an innovator and entrepreneur began at Alcoa Cleveland, where he worked as an Operations Research specialist and implemented a computer-based optimization & tracking system for the USAF F-14 program during the Vietnam War. His career in technology would lead to a sales position with Cyphernetics, where he became a top distributor in the country and President's Club member for 5 consecutive years.

As an engineer, he was a man ahead of his time devoted to the health and well-being of others. Inspired by his mother's cardiac illness in the 1970s, Mike went on to create innovative systems for the healthcare industry that helped redefine the relationship between chron-

Last week, the engine barn was insulated by Air Lock. This was completed in two and a half days, and what a great job they did. Next is the Drywall.














