Out of this search, local museums, such as the Lake County Historical Society, Fairport Harbor Marine Museum and Lighthouse and the Indian Museum of Lake County ioined the Painesville Railroad Museum to share the rich history in which we are the custodians.

Authors such as Dan Rager, Kenneth Springirth and Sandy Mitchell Pavick told stories of our past, which helped shape who we are today. Emphasis was laid on our role in the importance of preserving history before it disappears.

The Lenape Indians graced us with their traditional dress, song and dance. Ed Keyse, who is a civil war reenactor, brought to life the actions of Commodore John Carter in his heroic efforts to suppress rebellion along the Great Lakes.



The NYC was formed in 1914 and consolidated the LS&MS. The station was closed in 1971 when passenger service was stopped.
